

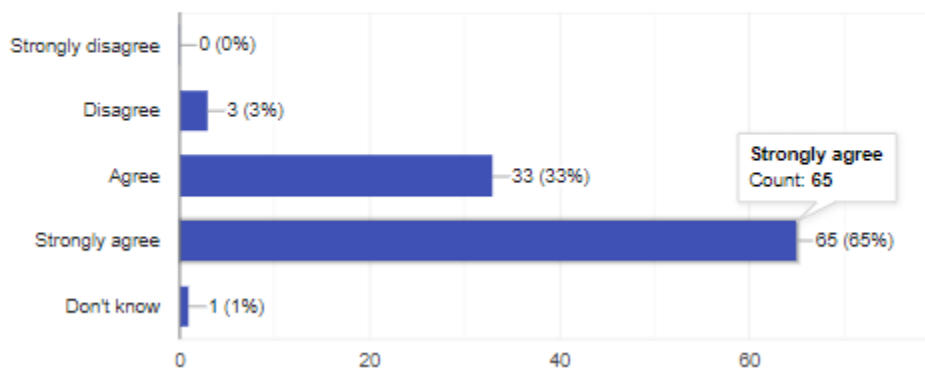
MAY PARENT SURVEY FEEDBACK

My child is happy at this school.

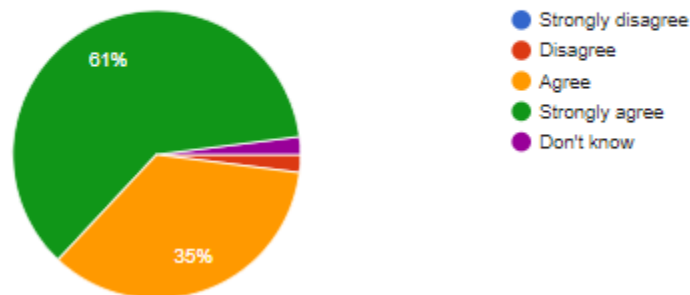
100 responses

My child feels safe at this school.

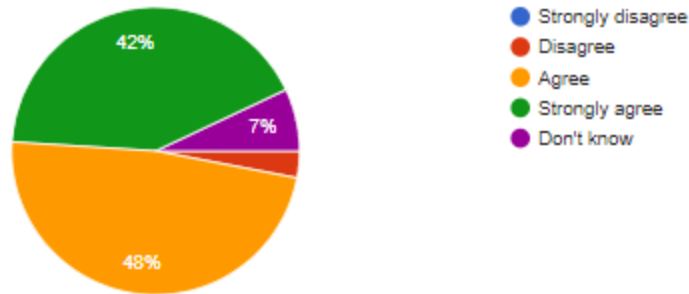
100 responses

The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.

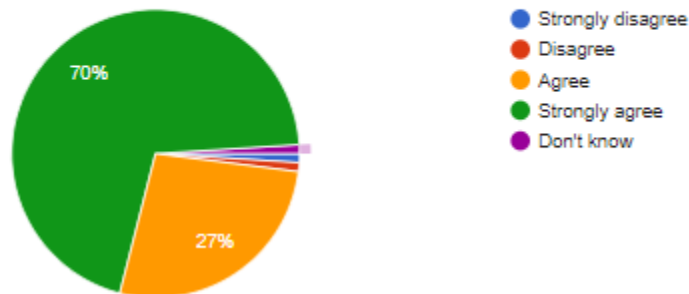
100 responses

The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.

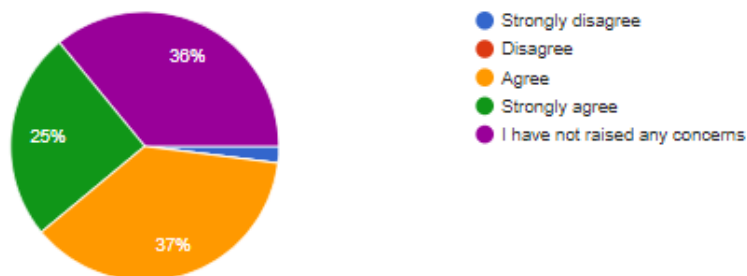
100 responses

When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly.

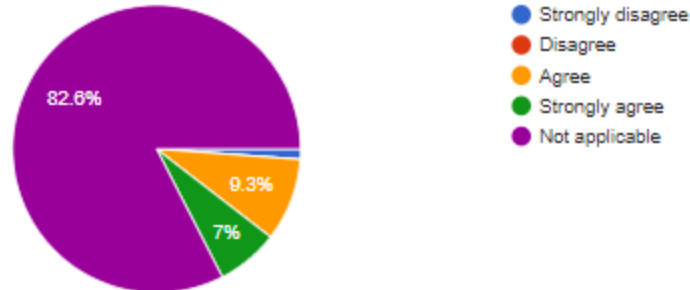

If yes, how strongly do you agree with this statement: 'My child has SEND, and the school gives them the support they need to succeed.'

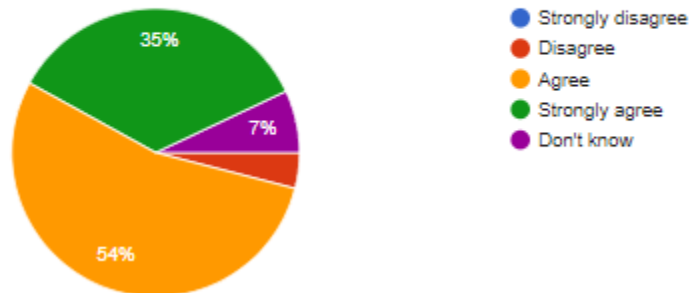

The school has high expectations for my child.

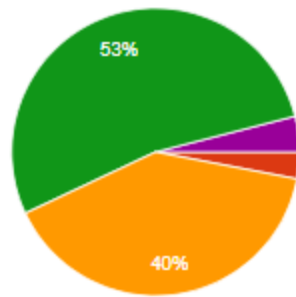

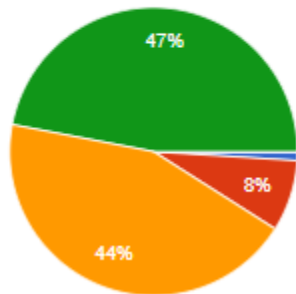

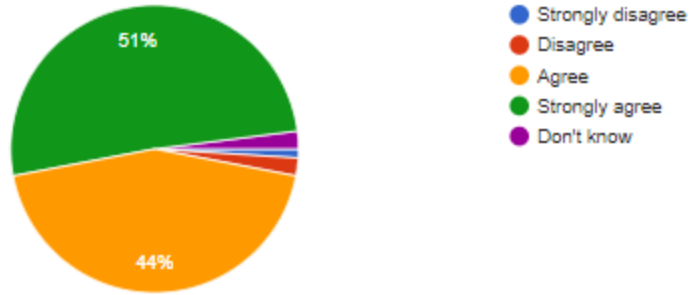

There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.

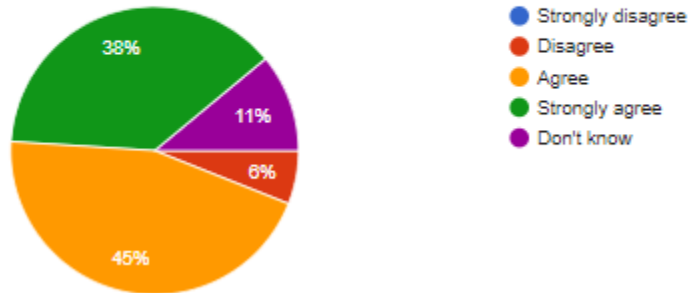

My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school.

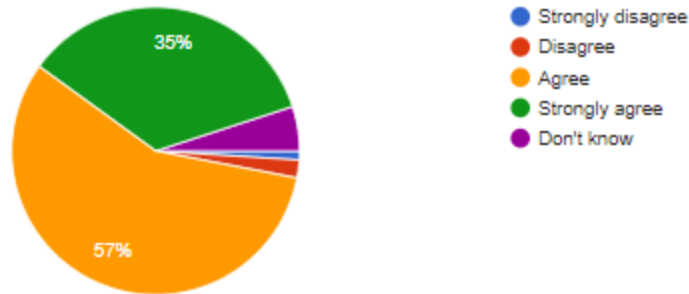

The school supports my child's wider personal development.

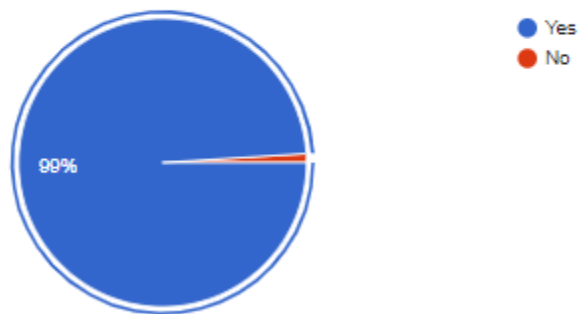

Better feedback at Parent's evening	It is statutory for schools to report on children's attainment once a year in the form of a written report. This will be sent home in July. However, we do believe it's important that you have regular updates so you can support your child at home.	From September you will receive a mid term report with achievements and targets for your child to work towards at parents evening.
Communication	<i>We currently use ClassDojo, Facebook, the website and a newsletter to communicate with parents.</i>	A consultation will go out in July to gather ideas and opinions on how to improve communication.
Parent Information sessions to be held outside of school hours	<i>Workshops are sometimes available electronically if parents are unable to attend.</i>	From September parents will be consulted on the best time for them to attend. We will offer a day and after school option. When parents are unable to attend a recording or electronic version will be available.
After school clubs	<i>Clubs are run by teachers and outside agencies. Many clubs run by teachers are by invitation only as they are targeted at specific skills and children ie building self-esteem, language development etc</i>	We have introduced Cricket club, Ocarina and Choir this term, that were not by invitation. These clubs will continue next half term. We will continue with our commitment to make clubs affordable or free.

<p>Consistent management of behaviour</p>	<p>We believe we have a consistent approach to behaviour. Our policy highlights the importance of praise and positivity. Some children however will need a more tailored approach if they have additional needs.</p>	<p>Share Behaviour policy with families and offer a question and answer session so they have a better understanding of our approach to behaviour.</p> <p>Thursday 19th September 2024 @ 9am and 4pm.</p>
<p>More pastoral support</p>	<p>We believe pastoral support starts in the classroom. Children who need it are offered regular check-ins with the classroom staff. If children meet the criteria we refer them to have support from the Mental Health Team or to have weekly sessions with Mrs Bubble. We pride ourselves on being a nurturing school.</p>	<p>Miss James as PSED Lead to share with parents the different levels of pastoral support available.</p> <p>July 2024</p>
<p>More frequent rewards shared with parents.</p>	<p>We currently use ClassDojo daily to reward children. Children are also nominated to be 'Legend of the week' by their class teacher and receive a phone call home from the Headteacher. Weekly we have a Celebration assembly celebrating children's achievements in school.</p>	<p>Ensure all families are on ClassDojo and aware of the reward systems.</p>
